Take notice of nature

- Support wildlife during the autumn by making: a <u>Hedgehog home</u>, a bird kebab, an apple feeder, a bat box, a beetle bucket and giving back
- Find out why garden insects are important
- Protect water voles and hedgehogs as they face extinction
- Make sure you <u>dress appropriately for activities</u>
- Share advice from <u>Action For Happiness</u> taking care of your body
- Go out and find some <u>fungi</u>
- Have fun with leaves

- Spot <u>conkers</u>, <u>nuts and berries</u>
- Find and identify Invertebrates
- Watch out for <u>migrating wildlife</u> & <u>animal tracks</u>

Keep learning

- Create a story/poem based on the changing season
- Make ink stamps with seeds/leaves, <u>leaf</u> <u>crowns</u> and <u>Autumn Art</u> to give to others
- Make a botanical bookmark
- Collect fruits to <u>make jam</u> and share with others
- Talk with others about the changing seasons and how it makes you feel
- Collect seeds, fruits and herb cuttings for gifts
- Keep fit and active in Autumn, use this <u>Thriving</u> <u>with Nature guide</u>.
- Access the outside little and often if it's cold and windy, perhaps build <u>a den</u> to keep warm.
- <u>Kites</u> are great for windy days and coats make great superhero capes
- Make an <u>Anemometer</u> to watch the wind speed
- Build a toy land yacht to use outside
- How is wind and rain made? How can we measure rainfall? Learn about the <u>different types</u> of weather
- Check out <u>traditional/folklore</u> weather prediction
- Follow the <u>journey of cuckoos</u> from Norfolk to Africa
- Learn about why leaves change their colour, how seeds are distributed, how trees grow into seeds and how insects survive the winter
- Read about <u>pink footed geese</u>, just one of Norfolk's seasonal visitors.
- Learn about <u>fungi</u>, <u>lichen</u> and <u>mushrooms</u>
- Find out how to identify trees even after the leaves have fallen
- What are winter berries?
